A NOTE ABOUT THE SAMPLE:

In this topline, findings based on gay, lesbian or bisexual adults exclude those who are transgender. Findings based on transgender adults include those of any sexual orientation. Queer adults are included in the total and in the gay, lesbian, bisexual or trans totals if they indicated they also identify with any of these terms. There aren't enough adults in the sample who are queer but *not* gay, lesbian, bisexual or transgender to report on that group separately.
